Get Serious About Our Relationship with Christ

You don't want a lukewarm relationship with Christ, do you? He certainly doesn't want a lukewarm relationship with you. He wants you to be on fire, not merely lukewarm. "So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth" (Revelation 3:16).

Get Serious About Forgiveness

An awful lot of us are carrying around grudges. I know as well as any how it feels to be offended and have our feelings hurt. And what I know is that it feels much better to get past it. None of us really have the right to demand forgiveness from God. But by accepting forgiveness we become obliged to offer forgiveness "For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." (Matthew 6:14-15).

Get Serious About THAT Sin
