When the Israelites were escaping from slavery with the Egyptians in hot pursuit, they stopped at the Red Sea. It seemed they were now between a rock and a hard place. But Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand still, and see the salvation of the LORD, which He will accomplish for you today" (Exod. 14:13). God then parted the Red Sea so that the Israelites crossed it safety and then it closed on the advancing Egyptians. In essence, Moses' words to them were: "Don't worry.
