# THE SIN OF SODOM

The Bible relates that God destroyed the city of Sodom because its inhabitants *“were wicked and were sinning greatly against the Lord”* (**Genesis 13:13**). What was the wickedness which brought God’s wrath down upon them? Some homosexual advocates try to make the sin of Sodom that of inhospitality. The Biblical record depicts homosexuality not only as a sin; but as a degraded perversion that goes against the very norms of nature. It is a moral filth and flagrant perversion of God’s design as it pertains to human sexuality. It is not my intent to make homosexuality out to be more of an atrocity than it already is. But neither is it my desire to water down the Biblical language in which God depicts the grossness of this immorality.

Millions of dollars were donated to help pass laws within our country which helped legalize homosexual marriages. But know that all the money in the world along with all the human laws a nation can pass will never make sexual perversion acceptable to God.
