WATCH THE LEDGER

One of the hardest classes that I had when I started college was accounting. My teacher was a stickler, there was plenty of homework, and class was a fast-paced frenzy of new ideas. It should have been an easy subject, but I didn't quite get the knack of it at first. It was the whole concept of debits and credits that I could not straighten out in my mind. Once I had it, I would stumble on another problem that would send me back into an accounting tailspin. I excelled in math, but that did not matter if I was not keeping my numbers in the right columns. This had a serious effect on my final ledger, and often affected my grade.

Over the years, I have improved my accounting skills, but it reminds me that we have to keep a close eye on our ledger book of life. We often think that the ledger book of life is broken into the good and the bad that we have done in life. That God keeps every account of every action and weighs them out on a scale to see if they are imbalanced. We do good to offset the bad that we infringe. We help here and there when we have often ignored this and that. We feel like that if we do enough good things in this world that God can see past our bad. Most of the time we just hope to even out the scales. The cold hard truth is that we have racked up a debt that can never be repaid by our actions alone (Colossians 2:13-14).

Paul tells us that Jesus set aside or forgave the sins that we committed on the cross. His death made the debt owed null and void, and freed us from the oppression of legality of the Old Law. It was no longer a ledger of wrongs and rights, but a clean slate to do no more wrongs. The beauty is that when we sin against God, we now have an avenue to ask for forgiveness from the Father (I John 1:9). This repentant heart and forgiveness allow us to build a closer relationship with God that shows His love and mercy to those who are truly sorry. The ledger that we look towards is made red with the blood of our Savior, and that's why we should keep constant watch of it.

JUST WHAT IS THE WILL OF THE LORD?

The apostle Paul declared, "Wherefore be ye not unwise," understanding, what the will of the Lord is" (Ephesians 5:17). The Lord has always had a will, or a plan for His people. Jesus, in speaking to his disciples, said, "...I seek not mine own will, but the will of the Father which hath sent me" (John 5:30). He taught this will of the heavenly Father to His disciples and through His teaching and the teaching of His apostles, we can know what "the will of the Lord is." In the old Mosaic dispensation, God gave His law through Moses and then Moses gave it to the children of Israel. There was no misunderstanding of this law, every person, even the children knew what was expected of them as they were taught the will of God from their youth up (Deuteronomy 6:2-24; Leviticus 10:11). They also knew the penalty for neglecting the will of the Lord (Genesis 19; Numbers 21:5-9). This law, in its entirety, having served its purpose, ended, by being nailed to the cross by Christ (Colossians 2:14), but as the will of God has changed from the Mosaic dispensation to the Christian dispensation it now carries the promises of God for salvation to those who keep His will and damnation to those who refuse to do His will. Jesus had been promised the kingdom of David, and although the Bible earthly kingdom of David no longer existed, Jesus came to this earth and established His spiritual kingdom, and church. He told His disciples, "...I will build My church..." (Matthew 16:18). As the church and the kingdom is the same institution, He sent His disciples to preach "the kingdom is at hand." He told those that heard Him, "...there be some that stand here which shall not taste death, till they have seen the kingdom of God come with power" (Mark 9:1). At the time of His ascension back to the Father in heaven, He told His apostles to "tarry in Jerusalem" (Luke 24:49). This they did and experienced the kingdom coming with power. Here they preached the gospel of Christ, and witnessed the power of the Word of God (Romans 1:16) as some three thousand heard, believed and obeyed His word by being immersed in water for the remission of sins and was then added by the Lord to His church (Acts 2:37-**47).** The apostles then went throughout the world preaching the will of the Lord. Jesus had given them the commandment to "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost...He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned" (Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:16). The book of Acts reveals the results of their preaching the will of the Lord. The people heard, believed, repented, confessed, were baptized in water and then added to the Lord's church (Acts 2:36-47; 8:37; 18:8; 22:16). As this Will of the Lord is still in effect today, we too, can be added to His church (kingdom) by obeying His will. I.D. Byars
