Problem With Demons

In Matthew 8:28-34 Jesus deals with legions of demons. They come running to Him: "And behold, they cried out, saying, "What do we have to do with You, Son of God? Have You come here to torment us before the time?" (Matthew 8:29). We immediately see that they fully recognized Jesus as God's Son. They knew His power to send them into torment. They also knew that a time would come when they would be sent into torment. We read in different places that a demon was in a person and did horrible things to the person. In this case many demons were doing terrible things. Such a person was not able to do as he desired, because of the control of the demon. They knew that Jesus had more power than they had, He could send them out, and did for many people. "You know of Jesus of Nazareth, how God anointed Him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and how He went about doing good, and healing all who were oppressed by the devil; for God was with Him" (Acts 10:38).
